Curriculum Framework



JB Cleland Kindergarten uses the Early Years Learning Framework for Australia – Belonging, Being and Becoming – to plan and assess children's learning and development.

Early Years Learning Framework

The following learning outcomes within the Early Years Learning Framework (EYLF) are used to describe children's learning:

- · Children have a strong sense of identity
- · Children are connected with and contribute to their world
- · Children have a strong sense of wellbeing
- · Children are confident and involved learners
- · Children are effective communicators.

Indicators of Preschool Numeracy and Literacy

The indicators of preschool numeracy and literacy describe the child being and becoming numerate and literate. These are evident within each of the 5 learning outcomes described above.

Numeracy indicators:

- I explore and understand my place and space in the world
- · I measure and compare my world
- I analyse, read and organise the data in my world
- I quantify my world.

Literacy indicators:

- I use language to connect with my world
- · I understand the language of my world
- · I engage with texts and make meaning
- I represent my world symbolically.

A day in the life ...



Each day at kindy is different but our main goal remains the same – to engage children in deep learning through sustained play. However, we have a flow of the day that we use to assist children with their sense of belonging.

8.15am Sign in, Parent Goodbye, Morning jobs

These include washing hands and placing drink bottle on trolley.

Settle in for a day of learning through play

9.30am Morning Snack

Sit with our friends and enjoy some morning tea.

Group Time

When the gong rings we come inside to the top room. When everyone is settled we do our Acknowledgement of Country. Through intentional teaching, we discuss topics and incorporate songs, stories, sharing and games to engage the children and enhance their understanding.

12pm Lunch

We gather on the outside mat to eat our lunch.

Slowing our engines down

Quiet music, reading and resetting for more fun!

Inside and outside play

Afternoon Snack

Children choose if they would like an afternoon snack.

2.30pm Pack up

All children assist with packing up ready for another group time where we typically share a story or sing a song.

3pm Pick up, Sign out, Goodbye

Until we see you next time at kindy!

Kindergarten Session Times

We operate according to SA school term dates.

Group 1

Attend Mondays and Tuesdays each week from 8.15am-3pm as well as alternate Fridays from 8.15am-11.15am (odd weeks)

Group 2

Attend Wednesdays and Thursdays each week from 8.15am-3pm as well as alternate Fridays from 8.15am-11.15am (even weeks)

A termly planner will be provided.



What to bring to kindy



What to wear

Children need to wear appropriate clothing to kindergarten. Please ensure your child can independently go to the bathroom, without worrying about belts or buttons that may be too difficult for them to cope with. Children learn by active participation and exploration, so make sure that clothing and footwear is suitable for freely moving play.

J B Cleland t-shirts are available to purchase from the kindy for \$30 each in varying colours.

What to bring

We want our children to engage in all that kindy offers – and sometimes this can mean getting messy or wet. It is essential that children have a change of clothes in their bag. Please ensure all clothes are labelled and send them in a plastic bag so that we can return wet/dirty clothes to you without making their bag wet.

Lost property

It is advisable to have your child's name on their clothing, shoes, bag, drink bottles and food containers. Owners can be more readily found if items are named. If your child does lose something, there is a Lost Property basket outside the entrance to the main building. Contents are donated to charity at the end of each term, if not claimed. Permanent textas are available if you need.

Sunsmart

The Cancer Council recommend that all children are adequately protected from ultra-violet radiation throughout the year. Ultra-violet radiation cannot be seen or felt, and the intensity of such radiation is not directly related to temperature. Families are reminded about the importance of applying sunscreen before children come to kindergarten. Children are supported to be responsible for their own sun protection at kindergarten. This includes hat reminders and the re-application of their own sunscreen. Sunscreen is supplied at Kindergarten, however if your child has specific allergies to sunscreen you will need to supply your own - labelled with your child's name - and complete a health care plan.

Hats are mandatory from September to April. Outside of these times sunscreen and hats are required as per the daily UV rating of 3 and above. Sunsmart approved hats can be purchased from Kindy for \$10. Sunscreen will be applied at morning snack time and after lunch. During this time, if children do not have hats, they will not be able to engage in outside play.

Food, snacks and drinks



Families are responsible for preparing and packing food for their child. Fruit/Snack time and lunch time are part of the everyday learning program at JB Cleland Kindergarten. The children have a mid-morning and mid-afternoon group fruit/snack time. This is a social time in which children have an opportunity to interact with each other and educators.

Snack Times

Two snacks (one for mid-morning and one for mid-afternoon) need to be packed and left in your child's bag.

Lunch Time

Each child needs to bring a packed lunch in a clearly named lunchbox. We encourage a healthy eating policy at J B Cleland Kindergarten to support children in building a sound knowledge of good nutrition and diet. Children will quite happily eat healthy foods if choices for less healthier options are limited in their snack and lunch boxes. Healthy eating choices are easier to model if all children are doing the same thing.

To support our healthy eating policy, we ask families to send nutritious snacks to kindergarten with their children for the following reasons:

- Research informs us that for the long-term health and wellbeing of children, it is vital that they eat healthy food from birth.
- To provide children with important vitamins and minerals.
- To encourage a taste for healthy foods and promote healthy eating habits.
- To avoid children pressuring parents and carers to buy and provide other less healthy foods they may see other children having.

Nutritious foods are those that are low in sugar, salt and fats. These foods are not over processed and have nutritional value for your child. Any uneaten food will be sent home so that you are able to gauge your child's intake. All children bring their own food from home, sharing of food at kindy is NOT allowed.

Allergy Aware

J B Cleland Kindergarten is allergy aware and we ask families not to send nuts or nut products in lunch boxes.

Foods we recommend:

Fresh fruits
Vegetables/Salad
Sandwiches with healthy
fillings
Sushi
Yogurt (not in squeeze
pouches)
Rice/Noodles/Pasta
Dry biscuits
Dried fruit
Fruit muffins/scones
Cheese

Please <u>DO</u> NOT send:

Fruit roll ups
Chips
Lollies
Chocolate
Iced cakes
Drinks other than water
Nuts of any kind (including in muesli bars)
Peanut butter
Nutella

Birthdays

Children's birthdays are celebrated with a 'Happy Birthday' song and a sticker. Please avoid sending birthday cakes, birthday food or other treats to kindergarten.

Nude Food

In order to build a greater awareness of the threat of increasing waste going into landfill and harming our environment, we follow a Nude Food approach. We ask that food is packed in reusable containers rather than in packaging that cannot be re-used or recycled. Through the course of the year the children will be involved in learning about waste management; why we do what we do and working collaboratively towards engaging in sustainable practices at kindergarten.

Costs

Sessional Kindergarten: \$280 per term

This includes our incursion and excursion levy as well as provision of a broad brimmed kindergarten hat for your child.

Fee invoices are issued in week 1 of each term. Payments can be made via the following methods:

- 1. Qkr! Payment by Credit Card. An instructions sheet will be issued to all parents.
- 2. Direct Deposit payment into the Kindy bank account.

Please ensure that you include your child's name and the invoice number as the reference for all payments made to Kindy so we can correctly attribute your payment.

Excursions outside the kindy that require a cost will be charged for accordingly.

Children cannot leave the preschool without prior parent/guardian consent. You will be notified in advance of local outings (e.g. walks) and/or planned excursions. All necessary information pertaining to local kindergarten outings and/or planned excursions, and a separate consent form, will be issued for each instance. A risk assessment is completed for all outings and/or excursions.

Communication



Seesaw

Seesaw is a valuable tool that supports the sharing of:

- curriculum
- documented learning
- important information

Seesaw can be accessed from a phone, tablet, or computer. You will only have access to your child's account and your messages to the educators will be direct and confidential. The Seesaw app is free and is password protected. You will be emailed a link and instructions prior to your child starting kindergarten.

Parent Conversations

Throughout the year there will be opportunities for parents to meet with their child's teachers both formally and informally. More information will be given to you once your child starts kindergarten.

Family Contact list

You will be asked if you wish to be on a family phone contact list. This can be used to assist with building connections and friendships. We ask that you use this list when inviting children for play dates or birthday parties.

Medical Conditions



It is the responsibility of parents/caregivers to provide adequate information regarding their child's health condition/s. This information is important in informing educators on how they can help with your child's health conditions at kindergarten.

Educators will seek emergency medical assistance for your child as required (e.g. medical practitioner, ambulance or hospital). Parents/caregivers will be responsible for costs incurred.

Health Care Plan

Children with a diagnosed medical conditions will require:

- an Action Plan completed by a Medical Professional
- a Health Support Plan and a Safety and Risk Management Plan completed in collaboration by the kindergarten and the family.

If required the appropriate medication needed is to be kept on site at all times. Parents will need to replace the medication when it is past the expiry date. The medication needs to have a pharmacy sticker on the actual medication (not just on the packaging) with the child's name and dose clearly stated. Without all 3 plans and medication requirements completed, the children will not be able to attend kindergarten.

Medication

If medication is to be administered by the educators, eg antibiotics, a Medication Agreement form needs to be completed by the treating doctor. Please note: educators are not allowed to give the first dose of a medication. If your child requires medication, please consider if they are well enough to be at kindergarten. No over the counter medication can be given (including creams) without a Medication Agreement form being completed by a doctor.

Illness

If your child shows signs of being ill, it is best for your child to stay at home. When a child shows symptoms of illness while they are at kindergarten, the educators will care for them and then contact the parents or an emergency contact person. Please inform the kindergarten of any illness that your child may have so that we can help to minimise outbreaks.

Incidents and Injuries

If your child has a minor incident or injury at kindy eg cut/scrape/bump, the child will be provided first aid at kindy and details of the incident will be provided to you through an incident report in Seesaw. You will be contacted by phone if a major incident or injury occurs that might require further medical attention.

Children's Safety



The Kindergarten gate is locked during the day.

Collecting children from kindergarten

Children cannot leave the kindergarten with anyone unless they have been authorised by a parent/guardian. You must inform educators if anyone other than the parents/guardians of your child, or those nominated on the enrolment form, will be collecting your child from kindergarten. They will also be asked to show proof of identity. If you decide to add any other emergency contacts throughout the year, you will need to complete an 'Emergency contact update form.'

Signing in & out

As part of our ongoing practice in providing quality supervision of children in our care, all parents/caregivers will be required to sign in and sign out their child on a daily basis. Sign-in sheets are located on the desk at the entrance to the kindergarten building. Any special arrangements regarding drop-offs and pick-ups can be communicated via the sign-in sheets.

Attendance and Absence

Please message via Seesaw if your child is to be absent, as we need to report on attendance daily.

Change of Address and Phone Numbers

Please inform educators as soon as possible if there is a change to your home or work address or phone number. Current records are essential in an emergency.

The Laneway

The laneway leading to the kindergarten is a pedestrian lane. Cars will need to be parked on either of the adjoining streets (Gulfview Avenue or Hewitt Avenue) in order to provide safe access in the laneway to all families. We ask that cars do not use the laneway at any time. Please do not park in the parking space near the playground. This is an emergency / loading space only. This ensures that the laneway provides safe pedestrian access to our kindergarten at all times.

Emergency Practice

Our Emergency Evacuation and Lockdown Drills occur each term for both evacuation and lockdown procedures respectively. This is to ensure the children are familiar with the procedures. The Evacuation and Lockdown Plans are located at the front entrance and exit doors.

Washing roster



Families are asked to assist with the washing (tea towels, smocks etc.) once during your child's time at kindergarten. The roster is placed on the window as you enter the building. When it is your turn to do the washing, you will receive a message via the Seesaw communication app.

Enrolment in school

It is compulsory for children six years or older to attend school.

It is important for <u>you</u> to register your child at your local school or the school of your choice. Attendance at J B Cleland does not guarantee a position at the local primary school.

Your child will participate in a school transition program, which is a series of visits to their primary school, prior to starting school.

Parents are responsible for taking their child to school visits and for picking them up afterwards.

Please note:

We operate independently of any school. Whilst we will endeavour to make the transition from kindy to school as seemless as possible, we are unable to answer specific school related auestions.
